**MOTION FOR LEAVE TO EXCEED
PAGE LIMITS**

Ariz. R. Civ. P. 7.1(a)(3) (incorporated by Supreme Court Rule 48(b)) provides a 17-page limit for motions. Respondent David S. Gingras (“Respondent” or “Gingras”) respectfully moves the Court for leave to file a brief exceeding this limit.

The pleading is Respondent’s Motion to Dismiss and, in the alternative, Motion for Summary Judgment. This motion is long – containing 46 substantive pages of facts and arguments. The length of this pleading was unavoidable due to the extremely complicated nature of the underlying case, *Owens v Echard*, and the numerous complicated allegations set forth in the Amended Complaint. In addition, the Complaint raises serious Constitutional questions of statewide importance which require a full discussion which was not possible to fit within the 17-page limit.

For those reasons, good cause exists to permit Respondent to exceed the page limits of Rule 7.1(a)(3).
